Staff, researchers, and students from any organization or institution working on Mt. Tam are invited to display a poster outlining a project related to the themes of the summit. Posters will be featured on both Friday and Saturday. If your poster is accepted, you must arrive early to get it on display before the start of the first morning session.

Students: You may opt to enter your poster in our contest specially for student posters. Make sure you note your choice on this submission form. Volunteer judges will score posters on clarity of content, ease of legibility, and style. Awards will be noted during the morning session of Saturday October 29.

Guidelines for all poster submissions

- Submit your abstract to mgentile@parksconservancy.org using the following guidelines
 - o Title: Clearly summarize your presentation in 10 key words or less.
 - Author(s): Include your affiliation and the best means of contacting you for further information. In the
 case of multiple authors, designate the presenter with an asterisk (*) after their name and use
 superscript numbers to identify each author's affiliation and contact information.
 - Content: Concentrate on results and conclusions using 250 words max. Should fit within a technical session.
 - Spellcheck and grammar check: Remember, your abstract in the summit program should be your best foot forward.
 - o Tip: Make sure your poster reflects and supports the Science Summit theme and/or technical sessions.
- Prepare your poster well before the conference. Get feedback.
- Format: No larger than 3 feet by 4 feet. Display boards are provided by the Science Summit. Submitter must provide the 3 x 4 backing so that your poster will present well.
- Content: Key concepts should be easy to read from 4 to 5 feet away. Use images and graphs with
 explanatory captions to convey important findings/results.
- Organization: Text and images should be arranged clearly and logically. Numbers/arrows can be helpful.
 - o Less is more! Use more white space and less words (or competing images) to emphasize key points.
- At the conference the choice of posting location will be on a first-come/first-served basis; all posters should be on display by the first morning session. Posters will be featured on both Friday and Saturday.
